# DCC Meeting Highlights

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**February 6, 2008**

The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Feb. 7, 2008, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive, Vandalia, Ohio. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Bob and Marian Eley, Harv Kiesel, Beverly Owens, Sally Pinnell, Michelle Rizzardi, Brenda Taulbee, Kay Wert Minardi, Tom Wilson and Ed Witte. Members Anita Patten, Bob Pinnell, Chuck Smith and Ben VanWye also attended.



President Ed Witte reported that he will start a B ride at 11 a.m. on Sundays in Troy beginning in March.

Vice President Brenda Taulbee had nothing to report.

Treasurer Michele Rizzardi reported that the CD that we have at Fifth Third Bank for the Jo Glover Fund needs to be renewed soon. She asked if anyone had concerns with her increasing it by \$500 since we received a donation last year. She would have to add this to the existing \$826.00 in the fund. Kiesel moved to add the \$500 to the CD, and Bob Eley seconded. Rizzardi also said the insurance fees for the club have gone down. Last year's cost was \$1.69 per member, and this year that amount will be \$1.49.

Touring Captain Tom Wilson reported that he was contacted by the recently disbanded Greater Ohio Area Tandem Society (GOATS) and accepted donations of paint, a large coffee pot and several wire signs on behalf of DCC. He hopes to soon transfer these items to the DCC storage unit. Wilson plans to have a ride leaders and coordinators meeting on March 9 at the Marion's Piazza at 1320 N. Fairfield Road in Beavercreek.

Huffman Spring Classic Co-Director Marian Eley reported that she has about \$1,500 in sponsorships already. She contacted the Brookville Chamber of Commerce about trying to get an organization to run a children's bike rodeo on the same day, but she hasn't

received a response. She does have some literature regarding bike rodeos and bike safety that parents can take home from the event. Marian and her husband, Bob, went to the Bike Museum of America, in New Bremen, and discussed next year's 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Huffman Spring Classic and the possibility of adding a 104-mile loop that would go to the museum. The museum agreed to open for the event if we decide to add the loop for 2009.

Membership Director Sally Pinnell reported that three new members joined between Jan. 9 and Feb. 6. Current membership consists of 289 family members in 121 families, 340 adults, and six honorary members for a total of 600 members. She added that the total number of touring miles ridden in 2007 was 274,346.

Social Director Beverly Owens reported having received nearly 60 reservations for the DCC Awards Banquet. She will contact the Crowne Plaza Hotel with the final count next week and update them on the menu. She also e-mailed Brian Davis to remind him of his commitment to be the master of ceremonies for the event.

Webmaster Harv Kiesel had no report.

Bikeways Director Chris Brown received an e-mail from DCC member William Beecroft about the proposed bicycle/pedestrian bridge over Interstate 675 near North Fairfield Road. Beecroft said the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission has announced a preliminary selection of transportation-related projects, and the bike/ped bridge was ranked third out of 19. If the commission selects this project, a grant would cover about 80 percent of the cost. Federal funds would need to be matched by local funds and, therefore, contributions would still be needed.

Chuck Smith was happy to report that DCC commuters logged more than 80,000 miles in 2007. He looks forward to presenting commuter awards at the DCC Banquet. Smith also invited everyone to attend the USA Cycling class entitled "How to Become a USA Cycling Official" at the Vandalia Justice Center Community Room from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 9. The class will include lectures and videos about racing. A test will be given at the end of the class, and those who pass will qualify as USA Cycling officials.

Smith, who chairs the yearly Clair Duckham Birthday Ride, said he recently communicated with Clair's daughter. She intends to bring the DCC co-founder to Dayton the weekend of April 26-27 to celebrate his 102nd birthday. The DCC ride will begin at 8 a.m. Sunday, April 27, at the Vandalia Recreation Center and we will ride to the Troy Frisch's Big Boy restaurant for the traditional party.

Smith distributed copies of Ohio House Bill 390. He explained that this bill is a follow-up to HB 389, which then-Gov. Bob Taft signed into law in 2006. The new bill consists of five additional items that are relevant to bicycling safety. After much discussion, Wert Minardi moved that the DCC support HB 390, Wilson seconded, and the board unanimously concurred.

Wert Minardi presented the minutes from the November meeting for review. Sally Pinnell moved to accept the minutes as presented, and Wilson seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

In unfinished business, raising the rates for DCC membership was discussed. An increase has not occurred in eight or nine years, and a \$5 increase is being considered. It was agreed that the membership will be informed of the intent to do this and be given the opportunity to vote, per the DCC Bylaws. One cost-saving plan discussed included decreasing the number of Spoke 'N' Links sent to bicycle shops for an estimated \$1,000 in savings per year. Small cards with our Web address would be distributed to bike shops instead.


The board also discussed ways to attract new members. Witte said there are several groups that ride out of Troy that have no connection to the DCC. He hopes to attract some of those people to the club with the ride he plans to start in March. Marian Eley said there are DCC members that ride the Saturday Five Rivers MetroParks "Bike for the Health of It" rides. In the summer, 60 to 80 people ride each week. It was suggested that we list the rides as club rides in an effort to win new members. This would require one or more DCC members to be responsible for showing up each week with tour rosters and be willing to have their name(s) listed as contacts.

Wilson said he wants to discuss creating a new members' ride at the upcoming meeting for ride leaders in

March. He has learned a lot by riding with the newly created Major Taylor Bike Club in Dayton. Sometimes they have an informative class prior to the ride with information useful to inexperienced riders. Everyone is very friendly and welcoming at this ride, and he would like to use this same format for a DCC new members' ride.

In new business, Wert Minardi presented a check to Rizzardi for \$66.01 from the Dorothy Lane Market Good Neighbors Program. There were nine DCC households enrolled, and they spent \$10,790.12. Kiesel said DCC members can sign up for the 2008 Good Neighbor Program on the DCC Web site if they would like to join.

The Five Rivers Outdoor Adventure Summit is Feb. 8-10 at the Wright State University student union. The event will feature human-powered transportation (canoes, bicycles, walking, etc.). Patten expressed interest in setting up a DCC table at the event and will call Greg Brummit of Five Rivers MetroParks for more information.

Brown moved that meeting be adjourned, Wilson seconded and the board unanimously approved. The meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.

## Bicycle/pedestrian bridge takes a small step closer to reality

On Jan. 31, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission recommended 19 transportation-related projects in the "Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality" (CM/AQ) category for funding through the federal highway program. The proposed bicycle/pedestrian bridge over Interstate 675 near North Fairfield Road was ranked No. 3. A CM/AQ grant would cover 80 percent of the total \$3.01 million cost.

The proposed project still needs to pass the MVRPC's Transportation Advisory Committee and Board before a final recommendation is presented for federal highway funding.

## Express your opinion

A meeting regarding the relocation of Austin Pike, and the proposed Miami 2 Miami Trail, will be held from 4:30 to 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 6, at the Dayton Wright Brothers Airport, 10600 Springboro Pike. The project originally was to include a separate, shared-use bike path. It is important to ensure that this proposed trail remains. Please try to attend this meeting.

The Miami 2 Miami Trail would connect the Great Miami Recreation Trail near Hamilton to the Little Miami Scenic Trail north of Loveland.

**Bikeway Mileage Report**

**Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.**

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

## You can help the Dayton Cycling Club save money

Everyone should read the front-page article about the need to increase Dayton Cycling Club dues. None of us like the idea, but a \$5 increase in annual dues is necessary.

Reducing expenses is also required. By far the DCC's single biggest expense is printing and mailing the Spoke 'N' Link. The average cost of printing and mailing a copy of the S'n'L is \$1.98. Since each member gets 10 copies per year, this nearly eats up the \$20 we currently charge for a single adult membership. This leaves almost no money for other club expenses, which are listed in the annual budget on Page 12.

One way to reduce expenses is to give members the option of downloading the newsletter from the DCC website instead of receiving mailed paper copies. It should be stressed that this is an option. The DCC Board of Directors considers the S'n'L a very important part of membership.

## DCC bicycle commuters accomplish another first

The Dayton Cycling Club's bicycle commuters passed the 80,000-mile mark in 2007. The 2007 total of 82,081 miles eclipsed our old record of 75,394, set in 2006. The increase of about \$1 per gallon in gasoline costs during the same period of time encouraged more and more of us to increase our transportation trips made on two wheels.

The trend continues. Even a cold January did not discourage 27 members who logged 3,395 bicycle-commuting miles in the first month of 2008.

### Neighbors set record, too

Our commuting friends to the south in the Cincinnati Cycle Club also had by far their best year in 2007, pedaling 53,240 commuting miles to absolutely demolish their old record of 41,814 miles set in 2004.

The fact that commuters in both clubs were on two wheels rather than four resulted in a savings of about three tons of air-borne pollution during 2007 and a total savings of 30 tons in the 1.18 million commuting miles the clubs have logged since we started the Dayton Cycling Club/Cincinnati Cycle Club Commuter Challenge Cup (DC-8) competition in 1995. Together, our clubs have improved the air of southwest Ohio.

## Be a Good Neighbor to the DCC

If you eat, you can help the Dayton Cycling Club.

Dorothy Lane Market annually donates a total of \$75,000 to community non- and not-for-profit organizations through its Good Neighbor Program. Members of participating organizations sign up for a DLM shopping card and then annually sign up to have a portion of their personal purchases set aside. In order for the organizations to benefit, each participating member must buy more than \$250 of merchandise at DLM annually.

Each organization receives a yearly check in an amount proportional to the amount its members spent compared with all of the charities.

In 2007, nine DCC households spent a total of \$10,790 at DLM. This represented 0.088 percent of the total for all charities. So the DCC received a check for \$66.01, or 0.088 percent of \$75,000.

This year we don't like what we see. Our expenses have gone up over the years, and our income is not keeping up. For example, this year we will no longer have Calvin's Challenge to bring in money to our coffers. After much hashing over the figures, we grudgingly approved a deficit budget for 2008 (see Page 11). To save money, we decided to:

- Reduce the number of newsletters we send to local bike shops.

- Offer the option for members to download the newsletter from the DCC Web site instead of receiving printed and mailed paper copies.

- Slightly increase the price of our invitational events.


- Put off needed software upgrades.

Finally, we came to the reluctant decision that we need to increase our membership dues by \$5 across the board. It has been nearly 11 years (May 1, 1997) since our dues have changed. This action would make a family membership \$35, an adult membership \$25 and a junior membership \$15. Note that even this increase alone will not put us in the black.

I hear some of you grumbling already. But what costs

the same today as it did 10 years ago? I can't think of anything. Regular unleaded gasoline cost an average of \$2.95 per gallon nationwide on Feb. 11; on Feb. 16, 1998, it was about \$1.03 a gallon. In February 1998, a gallon of 2 percent milk averaged \$2.57 nationally; I paid \$3.09 on Feb. 10. I don't think anything other than electronic items such as computers, televisions and digital cameras have gone down in price in the last decade.

In order to increase our dues, we need your approval. Article V, Section 1, of the DCC Bylaws states: "A change in membership dues can be made at any meeting at which all adult members present at the meeting shall have an equal vote on the issue. Notification of proposed changes in membership dues shall be mailed to all members at least 15 days before the voting meeting." Therefore, we invite all interested members to the April business meeting to have a voice in this matter.

We hope you bring suggestions of ways we can save and/or make more money. We will answer any questions you may have about club finances. We look forward to seeing you at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 2, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive.

### How to select a club touring ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.

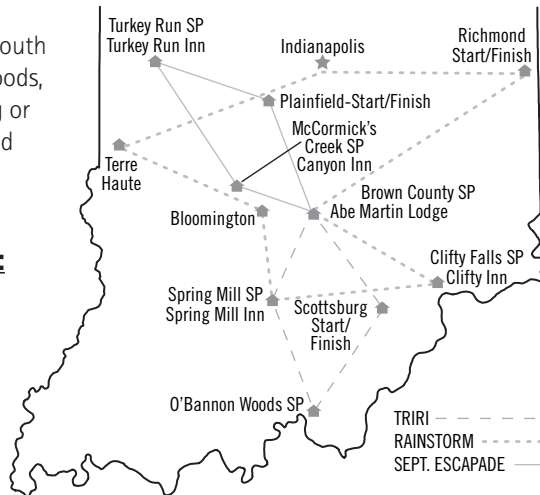
