The Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 5, 2008, at the Vandalia Justice Center, 245 James Bohanan Drive. In attendance were directors Chris Brown, Harv Kiesel, Beverly Owens, Michele Rizzardi, Kay Wert Minardi, Dwaine Wheeler, Tom Wilson and Ed Witte. Members Clara Minardi and Anita Patten also attended.



President Ed Witte called the meeting to order at 6:36 p.m.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi presented the minutes of the Feb. 6 meeting. The minutes were amended to reflect the change in the ride leaders' meeting. Wilson made a motion to approve the minutes as amended and Kiesel seconded. The board approved the minutes with one abstention.

Witte introduced guest Tara Dansing and her human and avian colleagues from Wings Over the Rainbow. Wings Over the Rainbow is a rescue organization for exotic birds, and it is are interested in doing a bicycle poker run fund raiser. Wings board members came to ask the DCC for advice because they have no expertise in putting on this type of event. The guests educated the DCC board about the needs of exotic birds, and the DCC directors gave general advice about putting on cycling events. Patten offered to call the Wings folks to talk about the logistics of such events.

Michele Rizzardi presented her treasurer's report. She said we need volunteers to audit the 2006 and 2007 books. Mark Minardi has the 2005 financial information and plans to head an audit of those books. Wert Minardi moved to accept the report, Wilson seconded and the board agreed without objection.

the date of the ride leaders' meeting to 1 p.m. Sunday, March 16, at the Beaver Creek Marion's Piazza.

Wright Wride Director Dwaine Wheeler distributed draft copies of his flier and asked the directors to look it over. He plans on offering Wright Wride jerseys but no T-shirts. He said he is buying aluminum bicycle signs to post as warnings along routes during DCC invitational tours. K&G Bike Center will provide mechanical support.

Social Director Beverly Owens stated that 69 adults and one child attended the banquet, and everyone seemed to enjoy the evening.

Patten suggested that the club write up qualifications for the various awards, in order to clear up some misconceptions and aid future organizers. She volunteered to spearhead that effort. She mentioned that we have increased the variety and thus the number of awards we give since 2000. She also said postage for mailing unclaimed awards has become quite expensive. Kiesel suggested cutting postage costs by distributing unclaimed plaques and bars at the ride leaders' meeting and at club rides. That idea was embraced.

Owens also said the membership had voted on the colors for the redesigned club jersey, and a check would be sent to Bike Atac ASAP.

In new business, Witte mentioned that the USA Cycling officials' training session had attracted a number of DCC members.

Wert Minardi said she would advise the membership through Topica about the April 2 vote on the raising of dues. She will send the notice a week before the meeting.

Rizzardi moved that the meeting be adjourned, Wilson seconded, and the board unanimously agreed. The meeting adjourned at 7:37 p.m.

learn. We've all seen children with "training" wheels — the kid just leans the bike onto one training wheel and pedals along, never learning how to truly "ride a bike." Here's an alternate method I've seen in lots of books and news articles, including one in the April 14 Newsweek magazine.

First, the child needs a bike with hand brakes. It doesn't need to be multi-speed, but we're going to be removing the pedals; a coaster-brake bike won't work well.

Remove the pedals, either with a pedal wrench or an adjustable wrench. You also want to lower the seat so the child can easily put both feet flat on the ground while sitting on the seat.

The child sits on the bike and propels it by pushing with his/her feet. This allows him/her to move at a comfortable speed, learn to balance and to use the hand brakes. The feet also act as "outriggers" if the bike starts to tip over.

Once the child is comfortable with this, put the pedals back on. Have the child practice coasting down a *very slight* incline with both feet resting on the pedals. The child should not try to pedal the bike at this point; rather, he/she should just get used to having the legs and feet pulled in, closer to the bicycle.

Finally, once the child is balancing well while coasting, allow him/her to start pedaling a bit. This, of course, is the tricky part — body weight shifts side to side a

little, and it takes some getting used to.

One thing that helped me learn to ride was being told that I wasn't so much "learning to balance" as I was learning to trust the bike itself. The wheels of a bicycle act as a gyroscope, going around and around, and the bike

doesn't really *want* to tip over. It's the steering (at slow speeds) that makes the bike lean one way or another. This is just another way of looking at how the bike works and may not work for every child.

This method may take an afternoon or it may take every Saturday for two months. It just depends on the kid. The nice thing about it is that the child is teaching himself to ride, and not by having you run alongside holding onto the seat.

This spring, teach a youngster or two to ride and bring 'em along on your regular rides. Oh, and make sure they become DCC members! 🚲

Roll into yesteryear on DCC's Covered Bridge Tour

The Dayton Cycling Club's annual Covered Bridge Tour is Saturday, May 24. Join us and return to a time when bicycles were new, cars were few and these covered bridges were in their youth. The youngest covered bridges on this ride are more than 100 years old!

For almost 30 years this ride has been celebrating the bridges' heyday. This is a budget tour, which means that for a small fee we provide the basics only.

We start at 8 a.m. in the Brookville High School parking lot at 1 Blue Pride Drive in Brookville, OH. Registration is from 7 to 8 a.m. only. We may be gone riding already if you arrive later than 8. Note that there will be no restrooms or water available at the start. There are fast-food restaurants and gas stations near the exit off of Interstate 70.


Choose from four routes, on rolling to hilly terrain. The 23-mile route has two covered bridges, the 45-mile ride has five, the 74-mile route has seven, and the century (actually 105 miles) rewards you with 10 covered bridges. Route direction arrows are marked (painted on roads) at intersections.

The low cost of \$5 per person pays for insurance, the route markings and a route map. A commemorative ride patch will be available for an additional \$1. There is no pre-ride registration. Riders must sign up the day of the ride, and everyone must sign a DCC ride release form at registration.

No food or drinks are provided. All routes pass through small towns where water, restrooms, snack foods, etc., are available at convenience stores and restaurants. Bring money or your own food.

No sag service will be provided, so bring a pump, patch kit and tools and know how to use them. Come prepared for bad weather.

If you are interested in spending the night in Brookville before or after the ride, there is a Days Inn (937-833-4003) and a Holiday Inn Express (937-833-9998) near the I-70 exit. A KOA campground (800-562-3317) is located about 5 miles from the ride start.

Bikeway Mileage Report

Bikeway miles are those ridden on a non-listed ride, at least half of which is on a bikeway.

Qualify for the Cyclo-Path Award by accumulating 125 *non-repeating* miles on recreational path rides. For example, if you ride from Fifth Third Gateway Park in Beavercreek to Xenia Station and back, you would have ridden 20 bikeway miles, but only 10 of them would count toward your 125 Cyclo-Path miles.

How to select a club ride

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include an area, length and speed classification for each ride. The area column gives a general indication of where each ride starts and ends. All rides are in Ohio and are loops, unless otherwise noted.

Ride classification (Class) and length (Miles) of the ride

are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The speed classification gives a general idea of the speed riders will be expected to maintain during a ride. Ride leaders are responsible for providing maps and/or accompanying riders unfamiliar with the route.
