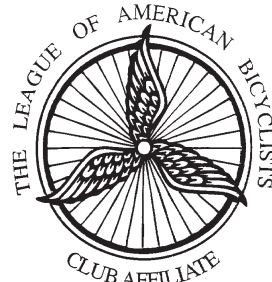

Business Meeting Highlights

The 2001 Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Monday, Nov. 6, in the Editorial Board Room at the *Dayton Daily News* Building at Fourth and Ludlow streets, Dayton. In attendance were board members Anita Patten, Chuck Smith, Janet Long, Kathy Williams, Mark Minardi, Bob Tackett, Kay Wert Minardi and Glen Miller. DCC member Barry Schroeder also attended.

A motion was made, and seconded, to approve the minutes of the Oct. 3 business meeting.

Board members discussed criteria that might be used in selecting a winner or winners for the Jo Glover award. A committee has been formed to consider nominations made by members of the club. It is chaired by President Anita Patten.

2000 Social Chairman Bob Tackett announced that he had purchased a turkey cooker for \$120 for use as a soup warmer at the DCC Halloween Party and asked the board if the club would be interested in purchasing it from him. The board agreed to do so, as other tour directors expressed interest in the ability to serve soup at their events. Tackett also said the Halloween party and ride made a profit of about \$60.

Patten reported that she received a \$50 donation to the club from Safe Passage Travel and Tours of Schertz, Texas, for her and Tackett's participation on a bicycle tour along the Mosel and Rhein rivers in Germany this summer. Safe Passage sent similar rebates to all bicycle clubs that had more than one rider on their tour.

Vice President Chuck Smith passed around a copy of a story on 94-year-old DCC co-founder Clair Duckham that appeared in a recent issue of the *League of American Bicyclists* magazine. Smith also reported that the Ohio Bicycle Communicator, the publication of the Ohio Bicycle Federation, carried an article featuring Steve Selz, who won his court case. Selz was charged by Trotwood police for riding his bicycle too slowly along Salem Avenue in Trotwood.

Treasurer Kathy Williams told board members that the 2000 Wright Wride realized a \$2,600 profit. She said she had not yet received a bill from Xenia High School for the use of the building. Wright Wride Director Mark Minardi said he had called the Xenia Board of Education to request the bill, but

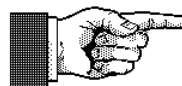

was told personnel changes have delayed the billing process. He expects the bill to be no more than \$400.

Williams also reported that the DayOx Tour had a \$631 profit.

There was a brief discussion concerning the larger events the DCC sponsors, with Williams emphasizing that event directors need to turn in receipts for all items that are purchased.

Newsletter Editor Kay Wert Minardi moved, and Smith seconded, that \$300 be added to the printing budget to cover the cost of the January/February newsletter. The board approved the motion.

Social Chairman Mark Minardi moved, Wert Minardi seconded, and the board approved adding \$1,500 to the social budget to pay for the banquet, which will be Feb. 9, 2001, at the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base Officers Club.

Wert Minardi reported that many of the October newsletters were delivered late because of problems at various area post offices. She said she's checking to see what can be done to have the ones that are bulk-mailed sent out sooner by the post office.

The 2001 Dayton Cycling Club Board of Directors met Tuesday, Dec. 5, in the Editorial Board Room at the *Dayton Daily News* Building at Fourth and Ludlow streets, Dayton. In attendance were board members Anita Patten, Chuck Smith, Kathy Williams, Les Handy, Dwaine Wheeler, Glen Miller, Mark Minardi, Kay Wert Minardi and Dave Bogreese. DCC member Barry Schroeder and Jeff Peistrup and Jerry Buck of the Yellow Springs Bicycle Enhancement Committee also attended.

Peistrup and Buck presented to the board a proposal that the DCC co-sponsor the Yellow Springs Bicycle Tour, scheduled for Sunday, June 10, 2001. The committee and the village of Yellow Springs wish to highlight the bicycle-friendliness of Yellow Springs with a tour mostly in Greene County that will most likely include a metric century and two shorter alternatives. They will provide snacks and drinks, painted road markings and maps, and sag service will be provided by Village Cyclery. In addition, local medics will ride the routes. Registration cost has not been determined, but the committee

hopes to keep it as low as possible.

The organizers requested of the DCC's assistance for insurance coverage, publicity in the *Spoke 'N' Link*, drink barrels and language for a release form. They do not require DCC volunteer assistance on the day of the ride. In return, the DCC would receive \$2 per registered rider, prominent mention on ride publicity and T-shirts, and space at the registration point for a DCC informational display and membership recruitment.

After Buck and Peistrup left, the board discussed the proposal further. Vice President Chuck Smith moved that the DCC co-sponsor the Yellow Springs Bicycle Tour provided that insurance coverage can be provided without incurring extra costs. The motion was unanimously approved. President Anita Patten will contact Pottinger Insurance for the necessary information.

Smith advised the board that the commuter committee met in November and is thinking of selling water bottles as a fund-raising effort. The board advised him that water bottles are not a good sell; in fact, the DCC still has a number of water bottles left over from a fund-raising effort from about five years ago. Smith said he would cancel the water bottle order and the commuters would try to come up with another idea.

Smith also reported that the Ohio Bicycle Federation is changing how it funds the *OBFC Bicycle Events Calendar*. It will allow free basic listings of events but will allow extensive listings only for events from which \$1 per rider is returned to the OBF. Board members said that sounds like a very expensive proposition for clubs. They pointed out that the DCC has for a number of years donated 50 cents per copy of the calendar for distribution to its members, in addition to purchasing advertising, and asked whether those facts would count toward allowing extended listings of DCC events. Smith said he would check this out with calendar publisher Jim Guilford and report back. In the meantime, the board is leaving it up to event directors whether to charge an extra \$1 for their events to give the OBF.

Treasurer Kathy Williams asked board members to watch their expenses very closely, since the end of the year is coming. She said she had not received the bill for the yearly insurance premium, although she expected it by now. She said there was a similar delay plus an unexpected price increase last year, and wanted assurance that the board would OK payment of the bill as soon as it comes in, even if it should be over the \$845 price she has been quoted for 2001. Minardi moved to authorize such payment, and the board unanimously approved.

Williams said the cost of the DCC locker has gone up to \$101/month, \$1,212 per year.

Williams also reported that she had received from Covered Bridge Tour director Mark Buchwalder a statement of \$18 income and \$380.57 expenses, making a net loss of \$362.57. Because of bad weather, the ride was not able to make back enough of the cost of patches ordered this year to bring the ride in under budget. The patches are not dated, and thus can be used in the future. Minardi moved that the board budget the money to cover the shortfall for the Covered Bridge Tour. The board unanimously approved.

Williams reported that five ultra-marathon jerseys remain unsold. Three remain for sale, and two are unaccounted for. Board members agreed that the club will not order jerseys again without getting the money from interested purchasers first.

Williams also asked for clarification on what organizations the DCC pays affiliation fees to, since she has not been billed by several of the organizations listed on Page 2 of the newsletter. She was told by Smith that the OBF considers us an affiliated organization by virtue of our yearly donation for the bicycle events calendar; without a racing team, we shouldn't be paying any fees to the U.S. Cycling Federation; we don't appear to be paying or receiving anything from the Ultra-Marathon Cycling Association; and Smith will look into our status with the International Mountain Biking Association.

Patten announced that Steve O'Neill has agreed to chair the committee that will audit the DCC books for 1999 and 2000. Anyone interested in also serving on the audit committee should contact Patten.

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to approving a budget for the year 2001. After numerous adjustments, Minardi moved that the board approve a balanced budget authorizing income and expenses of \$39,900. Smith seconded, and the board unanimously approved. (See full budget on Page 7.)

The board agreed to move the next business meeting to Thursday, Jan. 4.

At 9 p.m., Smith moved that we adjourn, Director-at-Large (safety) Dave Bogrees seconded, and the board unanimously concurred.🚲

DCC commuters increase annual record yet again

DCC riders set a new annual record for commuter miles in 2000, logging 59,414 miles through November. The 11-month total eclipsed the 57,433 miles pedaled throughout 1999. In addition, the 5,945 miles ridden in October 2000 were the most tallied in that month, breaking the record of 5,339 set in October 1999.

GOBA heading back to southeastern Ohio

Columbus Outdoor Pursuits has announced the route of the 2001 Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure.

GOBA will begin with the grand gathering and welcoming activities at the Gallia County Fairgrounds in the Ohio River city of Gallipolis on Saturday, June 16.

The first day of riding, on Father's Day, will be a 50-mile trek to Wellston. Bob Evans Farm will be one of the food stops, and riders will also pass through Jackson County and the Cooper Hollow Wildlife Area.

Monday's ride will take riders 49 miles through rolling Vinton County and along the Hocking Adena Bikeway to Nelsonville. Participants will stay at Hocking College.

On Tuesday, GOBA riders will pedal over more rolling terrain 58 miles to Marietta. This city on the confluence of the Ohio and Muskingum rivers was the first settlement in the Northwest Territory. Riders will stay for two nights at the fairgrounds or in dorm rooms at Marietta College.

On Wednesday, June 20, riders can take the day off to explore historic Marietta or ride optional


hilly 65- or 93-mile loops.

Thursday will bring decision time to GOBA participants. Plans are in the works to offer riders transport to McConnelsville so they can trim the 62-mile trip to New Lexington to 35 miles.

GOBA returns to McArthur, one of the 1997 host towns, on Friday. The trip will be 53 miles and will go through Shawnee and New Straitsville.

The final day's ride will be 49 miles back to Gallipolis. It will include the historic Humpback Covered Bridge near Wilkesville and the bridge in Vinton made famous by Morgan's Raiders.

GOBA 2001 will cost \$125 for adults 16 and over, \$70 for children 6-15, free for children 5 and under. Children must be 2 by June 16 to be allowed to ride or be pulled by a bicycle.

To register for GOBA, download a registration form from <http://www.goba.com/register.htm>; call (614) 447-0971 to request a brochure; or write to Columbus Outdoor Pursuits and ask to be put on the 2001 mailing list. The address is GOBA, P.O. Box 14384, Columbus, OH 43214. Also, official registration brochures will be available at Bob Evans restaurants and selected bicycle shops in the spring.

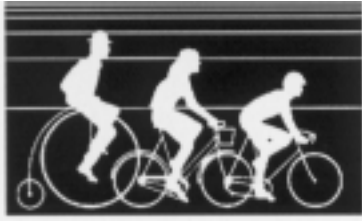

Touring Talk

Weekly rides north of Dayton offer Tipp-top cycling

Recently Bob Cornell dropped off the following information about rides he co-leads with Howard Tyson in the Tipp City area. The two lead rides Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sunday from Chmiel's Market in Tipp City

All rides are loops starting from a parking lot located just to the east of the Interstate 75/Ohio 571 interchange. The parking area for the rides serves a strip mall that includes Chmiel's Market, Burger King and a CVS pharmacy. Rides are scheduled year-round and leave weather permitting. Weather permitting means no rain or snow, with temperatures above 26 degrees. Last year, this pretty much meant year-round rides.

The Sunday ride has remained essentially unchanged for a number of years, with the destination being Joyland restaurant on Ohio 48 in Pleasant Hill. The ride is typically 30 miles round trip, with the riders normally back by noon. Some Sundays call out for additional bike time and miles, which this area easily accommodates. Terrain is essentially level farmland with a few hills in the Stillwater River area.

The Tuesday/Thursday ride destinations vary, thus they are listed with a range of 30 to 50 miles. Since destination and mileage depend on weather, number of riders and time available for the riders present, final selection of the specific destination is a decision often made by Bob and/or Ty just prior to starting the ride. Destinations include Brookville or Laura to the west, Piqua or St. Paris to the north and New Carlisle or Park Layne to the east. Heading south is a rare occurrence.

All rides travel through flat to gently rolling farmland on country roads with little traffic. All destinations allow for eating "a little something" before returning, usually by noon or 1 p.m.

New riders are always welcome. The pace is a strong C; however, these two ride leaders take care with the slower-paced C riders, waiting at turns or traveling at the slower pace.

Ride classification and selection

Monthly *Spoke 'N' Link* ride lists include a classification (Class) for each ride. Ride classification and length of the ride (Mi) are important considerations for riders when selecting rides to participate in. The class is the minimum speed a rider is expected to be able to handle. Ride leaders choose class and distance, as well as date and location, when completing ride-scheduling forms. Ride leaders are responsible for riding with riders unfamiliar with the route and/or supplying maps. Area is determined by the starting point of the ride. *Questions? Call the leader of the ride you're interested in.*

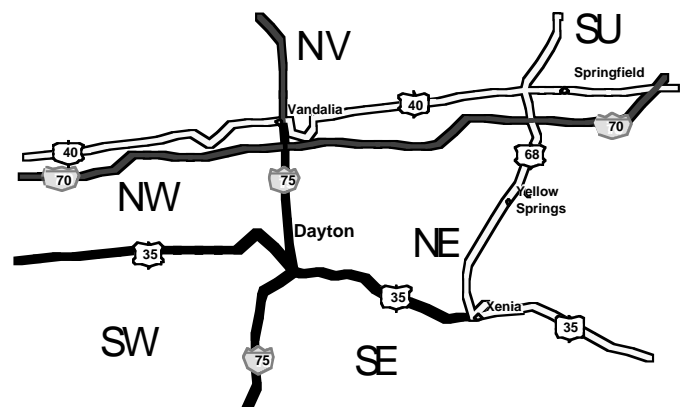
